LOOKING AT THE TEXT

What is the overall message of this section (11:19 - 13:3)? Try and summarise in a simple sentence. How does it contribute the message of the book of Acts?

Are there any key verses which help us see the point Luke (the author) was trying to get across?

Do you think the following is a reasonable breakdown of the passage?

В	11:27-30	Prophets from Jerusalem
С	12:1-4	Increasing persecution in Jerusalem under Herod and the Jews
D	12:5-18	Account of Peter's miraculous escape
Ε	12:19-23	Herod's demise
F	12:24-25	Barnabas and Saul return – compare 11:30
G	13:1-3	Prophets in Antioch

Some questions for discussion to get you thinking about the passage. You could ask similar questions of each of the other sections...

Why is this included, how does it contribute to the overall message?

Why would Antioch send help to Judea when they also would suffer?

Section D

Why is so much time and detail spent on Peter's escape (what would be lost by simply reporting 'an angel rescued him')?

Why do you think they were so surprised at Peter's release – what do you think they had been praying for? Does Acts 4:23-31 shed any light on this?

- 5) We pray for those suffering persecution
- 6) We pray for our own leaders and law-makers

PROVIDENCE – OR THE HIDDEN HAND OF GOD

The expansive progress of the gospel and the providence of God are evident throughout the whole of the book of Acts but are particularly noticeable in this section.

Some suggestions follow:

- 1) If there had been no persecution, not so many would have travelled so far (Acts 11:19)
- 2) Among them were people who were from gentile areas (Acts 11:20) They may have been Jewish or converts to Judaism, but having lived in non-Jewish environment were more likely to relate to and speak with gentiles.
- 3) The Jerusalem church sent Barnabas, who was himself both Jewish (a Levite) and from a gentile area (Cyprus) and someone who was open to new things eg he welcomed Saul when others were reticent (Acts 4:36)
- 4) Saul had had something of the order of a decade (estimates vary; for some help on Paul's timeline look at Galatians 1&2) to have a time learning from the Spirit how the Scriptures (ie Old Testament) pointed to Jesus. He had previously studied under Gamaliel, so knew the Scriptures thoroughly (Acts 22:3) He was thus able to teach the church in Antioch from the Jewish Scriptures.
- 5) Around the same time persecution increased in Jerusalem (Acts 12) thus increasing the 'emotional' distance between the old Jewish laws and lifestyle and the freedom found in it's fulfilment in Christ.
- 6) All this served to consolidate the shift of focus from Jewish Jerusalem to Gentile Antioch
